We are excited to present an innovative new program where you can directly partner with - and change the life of - a woman in Uganda. Strategic Sustainable Partnership Program (SSPP) prides itself on providing more than a funnel for charity. We're creating a new development model that combines temporary income, microfinance lending and infrastructure development. Many organizations solely provide employment, extend loans or improve upon infrastructure. But we combine all three elements to create partnerships that build communities.

What does it mean to be our partner?

By becoming a partner, you are partnering directly with a woman in Uganda and helping improve her livelihood. All you have to do is get a group together, gather paper and send it to Uganda to be returned as beaded jewelry (necklaces, bracelets, earrings, bags, and more). The jewelry can be as personal as you'd like it to be – it can be as simple as sending old magazines, to sending in your college thesis as a symbol of your fortitude. You can cater the jewelry to your group's specific wants or needs.

Once you receive the jewelry, your group is in charge of selling the pieces and sending the proceeds back to SSPP for your partner in Uganda. In doing so, you are providing income, contributing to the business loan, and helping fund future infrastructure projects. After your partner has repaid her loan, another woman takes her place, begins making beads, and starts her own business.

Our Partnership With You

Your group will receive a picture, story, and three journal updates about the life and progress of the woman you are funding. In addition, SSPP will provide you with pre-printed tags showcasing your partnership, with our logo on one side and yours on the other.

On your side, we ask that you spread the word. Let your social networks in on our partnerships so we can continue to grow our network and build sustainable change.
